Patient Stories

Raji

Raji brought his family to the U.S. on tourist visas so his two-year-old son could get treatment for cerebral palsy. The boy received a full evaluation at Elmhurst and started extensive physical, speech, feeding and occupational therapy. He made significant gains in a few months, and his physicians feared loss of those gains if he returned to India without completing therapy. LegalHealth's immigration attorney won three extensions of the family's tourist visas so the boy could complete the full course of his therapies.

Terri

Terri's husband is in prison and she struggles to raise their eight children alone. She is under treatment for mastoiditis, a dangerous ear condition, as well as depression with thoughts of suicide. She also sees a neurologist for her worsening headaches. When her public assistance, including food stamps and housing allowance, was cut in half for failure to comply with public assistance regulations, Terri panicked. Her doctor referred her to LegalHealth, where the attorney went through all the paperwork and found that Terri actually was in compliance. She applied for a fair hearing and represented Terri at the hearing. Terri won her appeal and all her benefits were restored. She received a \$2,000 retroactive award and \$641 in monthly benefits were restored.
